THANKSGIVING AT THE TABLE

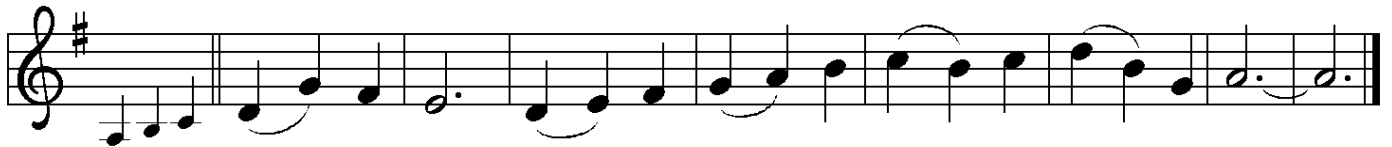
