I received this e-mail from a friend just recently and I decided to share it in our newsletter this month.

The only survivor of a shipwreck was washed upon a small, uninhabited island. He prayed feverishly for God to rescue him, and every day he scanned the horizon for help, but none seemed forthcoming.

Exhausted, he eventually managed to build a little hut out of driftwood to protect him from the elements, and to store his few possessions. But then one day, after scavenging for food, he arrived home to find his little hut in flames, the smoke rolling up to the sky. The worst had happened; everything was lost. He was stunned with grief and anger.

"God, how could you do this to me!" he cried.

Early the next day, however, he was awakened by the sound of a ship that was approaching the island. It had come to rescue him.

"How did you know I was here?" asked the weary man of his rescuers. "We saw your smoke signal," they replied.

It is easy to get discouraged when things are going badly. But we shouldn't lose heart, because God is at work in our lives, even in the midst of pain and suffering. Remember, next time your little hut is burning to the ground, it just may be a smoke signal that summons the grace of God.

For all the negative things we have to say to ourselves, God has a positive answer.

You say: "I'm too tired." God says: I will give you rest. (Matt 11:28-29)

You say: "I can't figure things out." God says: I will direct your steps. (Proverbs 3:5-6)

You say: "I can't do it." God says: You can do all things. (Phil 4:13)

You say: "It's not worth it." God says: It will be worth it. (Romans 8:28)

You say: "I can't forgive myself." God says: I forgive you. (I John 1:9 & Romans 8:1)

You say: "I can't manage." God says: I will supply all your needs. (Phil 4:19)

You say: "I'm afraid." God says: I have not given you a spirit of fear. (II Tim. 1:7)

FINANCE MATTERS



God's promise of eternal life through the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ is adequate motivation for anyone calling himself or herself a Christian. At times we are moved to give but too often we are unmoved and disconnected.

What motivates people to give? There seem to be five internal motivations for giving that are a part of our personhood. 1) Compassion: sharing, caring, giving, loving, serving and supporting. 2) Community: good fun, good times, fellowship, affiliation, belonging, and a sense of family and home. 3) Challenge: accomplishment, attainment and achievement. 4) Reasonability: data, analyze, logic and thinking that it makes good sense. 5) Commitment: dedication, faithfulness, duty, obligation, vows, and loyalty.

All five motivations are gifts of grace. It is thought that two of these motivational resources are generally predominant at any given time during a person's life pilgrimage, no one is locked into the same two resources forever. Our motivations may change as our circumstances change and our journey progresses.

It is our responsibility as Christians to daily respond to God's generosity by being: grateful, generous, mindful of the poor, give cheerfully, be proportionate givers, be faithful stewards and carefully plan our giving.

Edie Maas, our financial secretary has informed me that she has had to transfer some of our CD earnings into our checking account to continue to keep our bills current. We've done a good job so far in the Month of May – contri-

butions for the first two Sundays amounted to \$8,553.17 – if that trend continues, we will more than meet our monthly goal of \$14,885. However, there are several designated amounts in the monies given so far in May; in other words, we should not be using that entire amount to pay our current bills.

Thanks to all of you who have faithfully honored your commitment pledge or have contributed beyond your promise. As we approach the summer months, please try to remember that the work of the church continues. We also need to keep in mind as our Call Committee continues in their mission to find a permanent pastor, one of things that will be looked at is the financial condition of Faith Lutheran.

The Call Committee has received the name of another candidate and is reviewing the paperwork to prepare for the interview. After careful consideration and an interview, first candidate and the committee mutually agreed that it was not a good match for us. Please continue to keep us in your prayers.

CENTER FOR LAY MINISTRIES

The 50/50 Campaign is continuing through June 4! You still have time to bring in nonperishable items. The program goal is 50,000 pounds. Faith's quota is 1,000 pounds, and we are better than half way at press time.

This campaign will hopefully give the Center enough food to get through the summer months when children are not getting lunches at school.


Center for Women and Children



PRESIDENT'S LETTER

Isn't summertime supposed to be lazy? You wouldn't think so, looking at the calendar of events for June and July here at Faith!

In April your council members spent an afternoon in a leadership workshop led by Pastor Hawkins. It was designed to help us focus on better leadership skills and the roles we have accepted. The feedback from members has been very positive. Our goal is to discover and nurture the leadership talent available among members to lead us in the coming years.

Early in May a committee met to review the Congregation Constitution as recommended by the national church, and to update the Bylaws for approval by the congregation at the next congregational meeting. Most of the recommendations of the bylaws will remain the same, but we have decided to propose allowing three consecutive 2-year council terms as opposed to just two consecutive terms. You may recall that before 1994 the council terms were 3 year terms. We are also looking at our present committee structure to see if they meet our current mission and goals as they stand or if they need to be updated. Many congregations are

going to "teams" as opposed to "committees" to foster better results through participation by all team members. One team we are interested in creating is for Mutual Ministry. This team will work closely with the pastor to see that the needs of both the congregation and the pastor are being met. Any issues or concerns by either the congregation or the pastor would go through this committee before being brought to council.

As of press time, the Call Committee had received its second name from Synod and is reviewing the information received about this candidate. We will continue to pray for their wisdom and their success.

The first week of Pastor's Sunday morning bible study on Revelations garnered 30 individuals...I think that may be an unprecedented turnout for a Sunday morning class! It promises to be an active and enlightening experience.

On page 12 of this newsletter is a questionnaire from the Christian Education committee. We continue to struggle to find some way to bring more people, especially children, out for Sunday Church School so they can learn the founda-

tions of our faith to build on for their futures. We are willing to try new formats, but need to know what it will take to get you involved. Please take a moment to share your candid thoughts.

You may have noticed some new worship assistants. It's great to see some new faces helping out with the service! Any confirmed member can assist, and Pastor will gladly guide you through what needs to be done. If you're interested in helping in this role, please let Pastor or me know.

Pastor and some of the young adults (20-somethings) are hatching plans for activities for this age group. If you're in this age group, stay tuned for details. If you have ideas or would like to help organize some activities, please get in touch with Pastor.
