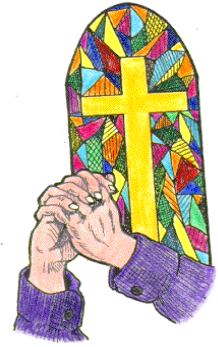

As you can see from our council minutes, we are really looking closely at where we are financially. We have taken a stance that change is a good thing and we need to

look at all aspects of our family life and what do we need to do better. We do want to just stay in existence, but grow and share our family with those around us.

As with many families, when expenses exceed income, you take whatever steps you need to keep the lights and heat on. You borrow from Peter to pay Paul. As the minutes reflect we will be checking with those individuals who gave the memorials to see if they are to be designated

for specific gifts to the church and if not, can we use them to help pay Peter back. Once this has been determined, then any designated memorials will go into savings so that they are available for their designated use. We may have to do this over a period of time, but it will be done.

As a family, we all must pull together. We continue to support each other; sharing the gifts from or personal treasure chests that God has so richly blessed us with. If we all share just a little more, we will reach our goals. We will continue to grow. WEEKDAY CHURCH SCHOOL

Weekday has started the last month of school for this school year. The children are learning about God's plans for Spring. They will plant seeds and watch them grow with the help of God's water and sunlight. They will take a lima bean apart to look for the baby plant that

God has hidden inside the seed, and they will look at the many seeds we eat such as rice, barley, wheat, nuts, and even peanut butter. After discussions about the fact that God plans for ways for us to continue to have plants, we will talk about the eggs in a bird nest and the baby kittens we will see on our farm trip to Shelby Co., Kentucky on the last day of school, May 15th. We will talk about milk and cows, and then get to see the cows being milked, and a baby calf drink its bottle. Wow, is that bottle BIG, but then so is that baby calf. We want to thank Linda and Vince Conner for hosting our school at their farm. This is the 28th year that they have played host to a group of fifty Weekday Church School children and their parents. Many, many, thank-yous for the time and effort you put into this day for our children.

People are asking about the enrollment status for next year. As of now all three classes are full. There are two names on the pre-K waiting list. These children will probably find a place in the class because Greater Clark Schools sponsors several pre-K programs for special needs children. For these programs to be successful and receive government aid, there

must be an equal number of regular children that equal the number of special needs children. They do not finalize the regular children who will be invited into the program until a week before school begins in August. Some of our parents who are registered for our school in the fall also put their child on this list because it is a four day a week program. If they are chosen for the Greater Clark program that lets a space open in our program, and a child is taken from the waiting list to fill this spot. This keeps us in a quandary all summer, but there seems to be no other way to make it work. For your information, we lost 7 children to the Greater Clark program last fall, so continue to invite people to call and enroll their child on our waiting list. Until we get to 7 or 8 on this list, I would assume that they have a very good chance to be a part of Faith Weekday Church School next fall.

As of this writing, all of the staff except Debbie Lake and Toni Hedrick plan to return in the fall. Monica Hawkins and her mother Betty Decker will move up to direct the younger first year class. This will leave a hole to be filled in the skills class in the pre-K program. Anyone interested in working this with Anne Steaban please talk to Carol Taylor, or she will be out looking for you.

Sunday Church School

Faith would like to thank the teachers who have taught this past year. A big thank you to Marsha Woods in the pre-school class, Peg Gernand in the Elementary class, Carol Taylor in the fifth – seventh grades, Lyle Gernand in the eight – twelfth grade and John Taylor with the adult class. All of these people have been very faithful in attendance, and well prepared for each Sunday. Thank you for your help.

In the fall we will be changing the format for Sunday school. In the fall the children in grades 5 – 7 will continue to meet at 9:15 along with the confirmed youth and the adults. However there will be babysitting available for children newborn through grade four. The sitter will use material called One Room Sunday School with these children at 9:15 am. A Sunday school will be held for the children 3 years through grade four during the worship service. These children will be in church until the end of the children's sermon. Then they will break into a pre-school group and an elementary group. These classes will be taught by eight different teachers, four at each age level. One of the four will teach each Sunday of the month. That way the adult teachers will only have to miss the sermon one Sunday a month. The children will return to the church at the beginning of the communion liturgy so that they can take communion with their families. We are hoping that this will increase the number of our children who are actively attending Sunday school classes each week. This will also increase their knowledge before they are ready to attend confirmation classes. We are looking for people to volunteer to teach either of these classes. If you would like to help, let Pastor or Carol know that you could help. The last day of Sunday school will be May 18th. Sunday school will resume on September 7th using all new material that links the class room discussions with the gospel for the day.

LIBRARY NEWS

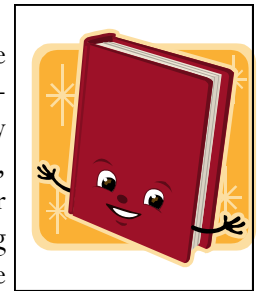
NANCY THOMPSON

Within the span of one week, I had the privilege of meeting two inspirational people who despite their fame, are as unassuming as your next-door neighbor. On March 27th, Al & I traveled to Hanover College to listen to Jane Goodall. The following Tuesday we went to the Kentucky Author Forum to watch National Public Radio's Jacki Lyden's interview with Greg Mortenson to be later broadcast on KET television. Both events left me in awe of two amazing people who have made a tremendous difference in the lives of many people.

Jane Goodall, who is affectionately referred to as "the chimpanzee lady", began her talk with the traditional chimpanzee greeting. She continued by telling us how her curiosity about nature and animals, along with her mother's unfailing support, set her on the path of becoming the most acclaimed and respected woman scientist since Marie Curie (someone else's description, not hers). For years, she sat patiently in the jungles of Africa observing chimpanzees until she was accepted. The result was her "discovery" that they used tools just as we humans do. That was only the beginning. Today, at the age of 74, she travels over 300 days a year encouraging people in her gentle but convincing way, to be good stewards of God's creation. Her message is that all that we are and all that we have are simply gifts of a generous and loving Creator.

Later on that same week, Al and I listened to Greg Mortenson as he unfolded his life's story to a sold-out crowd at the Kentucky Center for the Arts. It's a tale so full of danger and adventure you'd think it would have come from someone's imagination. When Mortenson was just a few month's old, his parents left the States to become Lutheran missionaries in Tanzania, Africa. To honor his handicapped sister who had died unexpectedly, he committed to climb the world's second highest mountain. He didn't make it to the top and had he not been found and nursed back to health by villagers who lived on the side of the mountain, he wouldn't have survived. Out of genuine love and respect for these generous, rugged people, he promised to build a school for their children. Little did he know what he'd have to go through to keep his promise. Today, he has built 66 schools and is the esteemed messenger of peace and goodwill to Pakistan and Afghanistan.

These two remarkable people prove that one person can make a difference. You can find out more by checking out Jane Goodall's DVD, *Reason for Hope: A Spiritual Journey* or Greg Mortenson's best-selling book, *Three Cups of Tea*. They are both in the church library.
