From the Pastor

In August, Lyle Gernand, Jim Hegenbarth and I went to Seymour, Indiana for a lecture series on church growth. The first in this series of 3 lectures was on discipleship. In September we heard about how to welcome and assimilate new members into our congregation. This month, we will hear about church growth and how those changes affect congregations. In this newsletter, I would like to tell you about discipleship.

What marks a disciple of Jesus Christ? When we are baptized, do we automatically become Christ's disciples? A disciple is nothing more than a person who wants to learn from the master. As disciples of Christ, we want to learn from Jesus his understanding of God. This does not happen automatically. We are not given all the wisdom of Jesus when we are baptized. Like any schooling, it takes effort on our part to learn from Jesus just exactly who and what God is and what God wants from us. Many people have come up with marks or signs that can indicate that we are learning at the feet of Jesus. A few years ago, the ELCA came up with seven marks and they live up very well to what others have said are the marks of a disciple. They are as follows: **praying, studying, worshipping, inviting, encouraging, serving, and giving**. I would like to explore in these next few newsletters each of these marks of discipleship.

Praying. As disciples of Jesus Christ, we spend time in prayer. We were created by a God of relationship, a God whom we know as Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. In order for a relationship to be sustained, there must be communication between the relational parties. That is what prayer is for us, communication with this God whose life is expressed in relationship. God is our loving parent, the ideal parent who loves us and wants the best for us. We spend time in prayer so that God might know who we are and so that we might know and understand who God is. Prayer can be formal, it can follow a formula, or it can be just casual conversation with God. We can remember those times with our earthly parents where we had very formal and serious conversations and those times when we just talked about things. God wants our prayer life to be that way too.

God also wants us to know God's plans for our lives. God wants to tell us what God wants us to do and how God wants us to be. God accomplishes that in our prayer life. That is why prayer is a mark of a disciple. It takes discipline to allow God to speak with us in prayer. It's easy for us to tell God what we want. That takes no discipline at all on our part. We just ramble on about what we want God to do for us. The discipline comes when we force ourselves to stop talking and to listen to God for an answer. The answer comes to us most often when we sit quietly and allow room for God to speak to us in our hearts. It takes discipline to give God the time it takes for God to speak to us. That is why we discipline ourselves to spend some time each day in listening for God's voice to speak to us. Prayer is more than just our saying things to God in such a way that God might hear us. Prayer is also listening for God to give us an answer, to share with us what it is we are to do and to be. Prayer is a discipline. It is a mark of a disciple.

If you would like to know more about prayer, I will be glad to talk with you about it. Come see me when you can or call the office and make an appointment. Next month, we will explore together the discipline of studying.

Those who know me, wouldn't be surprised to know where to find us on Saturday mornings. My husband, Al, & I typically go to the Jeffersonville Farmer's Market to load up on locally grown produce, then head down to the river for a brisk walk. It was there that I ran into Barbara Anderson, whom I hadn't seen for years. I had long admired her dedication to Haven House, a place of refuge for those in our community who find themselves without a home. When I thanked her, she let me know just how much my encouragement meant, especially that day. And when I mentioned that I went to Faith Lutheran, she thanked me for our church's past support.

Several weeks later, I ran into Barbara at the farmer's market again. This was soon after an article had appeared in the Courier-Journal stating that unless a large tax payment was made, she would lose the building. Barbara let me know then, that she had put everything in the Lord's hands. She would accept whatever He wanted her to do, even if it meant giving up Haven House.

Barbara didn't have long to wait. The following morning, she learned that a man who directs a similar facility in Florida named Sean Cononie, was donating half the needed monies. The community came through with the rest. One challenge met, many more to go.

Was it a coincidence that I would meet Barbara Anderson when I did - not just once, but twice? I don't think so. I believe God not only had a hand in our meeting when we did, but more importantly, in solving the problem at hand. If you think He doesn't do such things, let me recommend a series of books in our library called *Small Miracles*. Each true story compiled by Halberstam and Leventhal, tells how an invisible Hand has guided ordinary people to do extraordinary things. I would often read them to my mother who suffered from Alzheimer's disease. Before starting to read, however, we would share a chuckle or two. Seldom could I get through a story without having to grab a tissue.

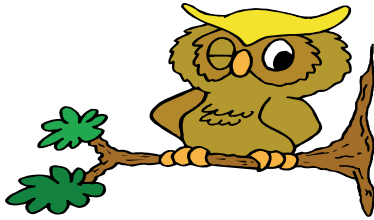
Bottom line, all of us are connected to each other and there is a purpose to our lives. Imagine what life would be like if love was the glue!

CHRISTIAN EDUCATION**CAROL TAYLOR**

Pastor Scott said it well when he said, "It takes a whole church to run the education program at Faith." This was stated at the installation service on Rally Day, Sept 12th. There are eight people involved in teaching the Sunday school program, seventeen in the weekday program, Pastor is teaching the weekday Bible study on Thurs at 1:00 and co-teaching with Carol Taylor the confirmation class on Wed. evening. Six people are ready to begin planning for Vacation Bible School next summer at the writers meeting to be held on October 4th @ 7:00 pm. That is thirty –three people involved in the educational program at Faith Lutheran. That is easily 1/3 of the average Sunday attendance; one- third of this village. Wow!!! Now add to this the people involved in the WELCA programs and you can see the important roll education plays in the life of this congregation.

The Christian Education committee will sponsor our traditional First Sunday in Advent pitch in supper and program. We will be making Jessie Tree Advent devotional aids to be used in our home. These can be used for family devotions during the four weeks of Advent. The patterns are coming from South Central conference. This will be held on Sunday, November 28 with dinner at 5:00 and the craft projects at 6:00pm. We will also sponsor the Christmas Program on Sunday 19th. This again will be the annual pitch –in dinner with the Sunday school children and youth presenting the Christmas program for our congregation. Plan to start and end your Advent season with dinner and these programs with your church family.

The following letter to parents is from the IK Synod Christian Education Handbook. I felt it was worth sharing with all of you. If you do not have any little ones in your home, come to Sunday school yourself, and share the letter with your grown children, a neighbor, or friends.

Dear Parents//Guardians//Caregivers,

God's blessings to you and your family! The Christian Education Ministry Team is looking forward to the 2010-2011 school year. We are working hard to make the best possible Sunday School experience available to your child at Faith Lutheran Church. Our philosophy for Christian education is called the "Triangle of Faith Formation." At the corners of the triangle are the child, the family, and the Sunday School teacher. Each one has a responsibility in ensuring that the child learns the teachings of the Bible. When one corner or angle is missing, faith formation is limited.

When the family is involved, the learning experience of the child will be enhanced. The expectations for you as caregivers are to:

Bring your child to Sunday School or make sure that the child attends.

Set the example for your child by attending adult Bible study.

Discuss the lesson with your child. Show an interest in what your child is learning.

Help your child understand the concepts.

Help your child understand at his level and be able to apply and explain the lesson from the Bible to parents, siblings, extended family, friends, and the community.

Pray with your child.

Did we mention that you should make sure that your child attends Sunday School?

Oh yes, did we mention that you should also set the example by attending adult Bible study yourself? This will increase your own personal knowledge of the Bible and your confidence for discussing the Bible lesson with your child.

Your Christian Education Ministry Team is working hard to create a quality Sunday School experience for your child. We are responsible for providing the very best learning experience and environment for your child to grow in the grace and knowledge of our Triune God. We have selected Sunday School materials which are consistent with achieving age-based objectives. These expectations are the cornerstone of our Sunday School program. They were developed to define what children entering or involved in catechism classes should know. Most importantly, we have a dedicated and talented group of new teachers for leading your child's learning experience. Please help and encourage them whenever possible.

The Christian Education Ministry Team is dedicated to providing opportunities for your child to grow spiritually and build a close relationship with Jesus. Let us work together to enable this to happen.

These 3 will make it into the pre-K program next year because they are on the waiting list at this time. We will take 28 pre-K students next fall, 25 from this year's first year class will automatically move up and the three from the waiting list will make up the 28 students. . Some of the first year students will go to the 4 day Greater Clark program, so there should be a few spots available next February 1st for the pre-k program.

The little ones are learning that God loves them and their families. The Pre-K's are learning that God made the trees, food, and flowers. They will study the fact that God puts seeds in all things so that we will always have pumpkins and apples. One day the children will chop apples and turn them into apple sauce. Boy, does the building ever smell good that day! God is so AWESOME to think and make of all of this for us. Thank-you, thank-you, thank-you God, for our families, friends, and food, is our song.

THURSDAY ADULT BIBLE CLASS

This group of nine adults meets every Thursday at one. We are working our way through Genesis at this time. Pastor has a wealth of knowledge about the Old Testament at his command and shares it as we read and discuss this scripture. We would like to have more people give this class a try. We are also taking turns bringing lunch for the group. We are using the good Lutheran style, "If you feed them they will come", motto. We hope the educational opportunity and the good food will entice you to give it a try.

South Central Conference Youth

There were 40 youth and 8 plus adults from the Louisville area at the Taylor's home on August 29th. Six area churches were represented in this group. The youth and adults planned the events for our conference youth for the school year 2010-2011. The big new event will be a Servant Trip to Appalachia with Hand in Hand Ministries and then a fun stop on the way home at a white water rafting area. This trip will definitely need help from the Noisy offering for several of our youth to be able to participate. As a large group, we will also do the 24 hour famine during Lent. Several other fun events have also been scheduled that include the Broom Ball event at Iceland Ice Rink, a trip to the Fun Farm for Lazer Tag or Paint ball, and an evening in the Corn Maize. This group has been a big help to all our youth groups because each of our churches has a limited number of youth, but when we put them all together we have a group large enough for group discounts and large enough for lots of inter- action between the teens. Can you imagine 10 years from now when the young adults in our church already know the young adults in the other Lutheran Churches in this area. What could happen with this????? Only God knows his plans for where this could go and what it will accomplish. Right now we are planting seeds and hope they are falling on the good ground.

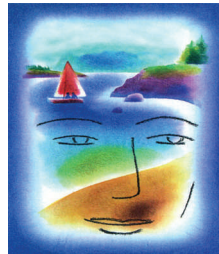

CENTER FOR LAY MINISTRY

At our most recent board meeting we were given this hand out which I would like to share with you.

Why is there still hunger in Indiana?

A 32 hour per week job, paying \$7.25 per hour (federal minimum wage)

32 hours x \$7.25 x 52 weeks =	\$12,064
If 15% goes to FICA and taxes	1,810
And \$400/month for rent or mortgage	4,800
And \$125/month utilities (heat, lights, phone)	1,500
And \$150/month goes for transportation (payments, gas)	1,800
And \$50/month for personal hygiene, laundry, lawn, repairs, etc.	600



You would be left with \$1,554 a year or just under \$30/week and would still need to cover a year's worth of

Food, Child Care, Clothing, Medical/Dental Insurance, Charitable/Church Contributions, Savings/Retirement, School supplies/fees, and everything else

Using the same scenario as above...If you worked 40 hours/week @ \$8.00 per hour your gross annual pay would be \$16,640.

Your taxes would be \$2,496/year. Keeping the same amounts for rent, utilities, etc. as above you would be left with \$5,444.00 for the year or \$105/week to cover all of the other expenses like food, clothing, etc.

If you worked 40 hours/week at \$10.00 using same expenses as above you would be left with \$173/week for all expenses like food, clothing, insurance, etc.

Using the same scenarios, imagine if... You had two children to raise? You had a chronic, non-life threatening illness that required monthly prescriptions. Your child broke a tooth on the playground and needed dental work. Your car needed a new radiator or set of tires. You were trying to help your 80 year old mother who survives on Social Security

Definitely some Food for Thought

In August 2010, the Center's Food Pantry served 706 households or 1,795 persons in Clark County. A total of 35,519 pounds of food was given to our neighbors.

The food pantry committee and CLM volunteers are busy planning for our Christmas Basket program for this year. Sign-ups for the baskets will be the first weeks of November at the Center. Faith may be helping with this program in a whole new way this year, so look for more details to come.

Bliss House remains full with some overflow into Bliss Too. There continues to be a high demand for this program in our community. Five women have completed the program and graduated since January.

We will be collecting Mac&Cheese for the month of October for the food pantry.

Thanks to all who participate in the month collection or donate in other ways to the Center for Lay Ministries.
