
### From the Pastor

May God grant you rest and relaxation this summer and may you give God thanks and praise for the blessings that summer brings.



**Will We See You at Vacation Bible School?****WHY WATER?**

If no human action is taken, as many as 135,000,000 will die from water-related diseases by the year 2020.

**Water Facts:**

A child dies every fifteen seconds due to unsafe drinking water, poor sanitation and hygiene.

80% of all sickness in the world is attributable to unsafe water and sanitation.

Women and female children spend more than 200 million hours each day collecting water from distant often polluted sources.

In the world's poorest countries - over 5,000 children each die each day. Poor water contribute to almost 90% of these deaths.

Every year, an estimated 19 million children under five die from diarrheal diseases. This year, about 2,200,000 children will die of dehydration caused by diarrhea. 80% of them in the first two years of their life.

Worldwide 884 million people live without clean water and 2.5 billion people live without toilets every day of their lives.

People suffering from preventable diseases caused by unsafe water and inadequate sanitation occupy half of the hospital beds in the developing world.

Current evidence shows that 1.7 million deaths could be avoided each year by providing access to safe drinking water, sanitation and hygiene. The single most effective intervention is hand washing with soap, which would cut diarrhea deaths in half.

If we did nothing other than provide access to clean water, without any other medical intervention, we could save 2 million lives a year.

Dear Teachers and Parents of VBS Children:

We are nearing the time for VBS and it is our goal to teach a lesson of "giving" to those who are in need. To illustrate this important lesson that "it is more blessed to give than to receive", we will be having a Shoe Drive to benefit EDGE OUTREACH. EDGE is a non-profit organization that provides water purification systems to countries and people who do not have access to clean drinking water. EDGE collects used shoes, and via a partnership with the Shoeman Water Project, the used shoes are sold or converted into playground materials and the proceeds are used to purchase water purification systems. EDGE has put water purification systems in Haiti, Dominican Republic, Costa Rica, India, Africa and Pakistan. You can visit EDGE at [www.edgeoutreach.com](http://www.edgeoutreach.com).

The shoes we collect will be exported to foreign countries where they are sold for pennies on the dollar to families who would not otherwise be able to afford shoes to wear. Many diseases and infections are transmitted through the soil into the skin of the feet of children, women and men.

We are asking that you donate the shoes that are no longer being worn by you and your children. Just a small amount of time in collecting unworn shoes from closets, the garage, and the basement can improve the quality of life for a child or adult. We encourage you to ask family members, church members, neighbors and friends to do the same. All donations are tax deductible. If you would like a tax deductible receipt, simply put your name and address on a card or piece of paper and attach it to your bag(s) of shoes when you drop them off. EDGE will send you a tax deductible receipt.

Our Shoe Drive will be held from June 27—June 30 and shoes can be dropped off at Faith Lutheran Church. Our goal is to collect a minimum of 100 lbs. of shoes (each pair of shoes, when averaged, weighs about 1 pound).

The Goodwill Stores have used shoes for purchase at a small price if your child collects money from family, friends, and neighbors. We encourage you to allow your student(s) to make the purchase and put these shoes into a bag and bring them to VBS to further reinforce the privilege of giving for the benefit of others who are less fortunate.
